Logic and Accuracy testing, Central Absentee Precinct, spare scanner and writer  
Ten OFFICIAL vDrives received from Hart, Monday, April 23.. All other vDrives returned to Hart at same time.

Board conducted L&A testing of one each scanner and writer, set up for CAP. Placed seals on vDrive compartments and handles.  
Also conducted L&A testing of one each spare scanner and writer. These machines were no set up for a specific precinct; that will be done if the machines are put into service.

All L&A testing completed without problems.

Charge batteries

Batteries removed from all other scanners and writers; placed in chargers.

Distribute ballots to precincts

June 12 primary election ballots were counted and placed in sealed boxes for pick-up by precinct chiefs on June 11.

- General Registrar ordered 2800 ballots, however, Hart shipped only 2,700. All precinct ballots were counted and packed except Precinct 5. Hart will ship an additional 100 Republican and 100 Democratic ballots. Only 600 Republican and 600 Democratic ballots were placed in Precinct 5 box; box will not be sealed until additional ballots arrive.

Ballots for all precincts were secured in General Registrar vault.


Secretary completed Ballot Report for State Department of Elections.
