RE: MR. JOE SCHLATTER, ELECTORAL BOARD

RE: MS. ANN H. KLOECKNER, ESQ, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, RAPPAHANNOCK LEGAL SERVICES

Ms. Kloeckner came before the board today to thank them for the support they have given and asked to level fund them in the upcoming budget. She then gave statistical information regarding the County's clients they have serviced. She said they represent those that can't afford legal council in many different cases such as civil protective orders, unemployment benefits, land-lord issues, social

security denials etc. She noted that this service helps keep a strain off of social services as well as the court system. Their motto is "Justice for all" and they are very proud of the work they do. Supervisor Long asked what days they visit First Baptist Church. Ms. Kloeckner stated that the days vary but can send a schedule soon.

RE: MR. PAUL LEE, ROBINSON, FARMER, COX-AUDIT DISCUSSION

Mr. Lee came today to discuss the 2015 Audit. He talked about several aspects of the audit and notes in the management letter. He stated that 2015 tax collection is at 100%. One management letter item was noted and was described as the school detail report for the expenditure side or reconciliation. Supervisor Tomlin asked how common it was for school systems to have a different account program then the County. Mr. Lee said about half, so pretty common and they are having the same issues.

Ms. Ellen Kirby, Treasurer, also spoke on the updated tax collection which she stated is over 97% and the same as this time last year. She noted that this is on target to be 99% by June 30th.

RE: MR. RICK MCCLURE, CHIEF EMS – UPDATE

Chief McClure reported that 7 new people have been hired and 5 of those are advanced EMT's. He then spoke about the purchase of the rescue squad that is being housed at Mid-County. Mr. McClure stated that they are going to start 24 hour coverage on Sunday morning. He said they have reached out to the squads for their input and have heard from Northumberland and Callao. They have agreed to work out of Mid-County squad building. Mr. McClure said he wants to keep the volunteer agencies healthy and if the paid take on everything then we may not have any volunteers. Other items discussed were the difference in potential response time as well as building rotations.

Supervisor Long asked for flyers to go around at the local churches with information to the people concerning the billing service. Supervisor Tomlin expressed his concern with the billing system and the new program starting the same day.

Zoning Administrator Marston described the request for the exception to the Chesapeake Bay Act in order to construct a single family dwelling within the RPA. Ms. Fox was present for the meeting as well as her Engineer, Mr. Joel Pinnix. Mr. Pinnix stated they were here 8 months ago and was asked to gather more information and they are back with the updates. He said they have an updated site plan with a modest dwelling. Mr. Matt Roth with Environmental Conservation in Newport News was also at the meeting representing Ms. Fox.

Supervisor Tomlin questioned the location of the house and whether it could be moved so that it would not need to be in the RPA. Mr. Pinnix stated that the area Supervisor Tomlin is referring to is where the alternative drain-field is going to be with the primary and reserve.

Public Hearing Open

Mr. Nathan Moore said he is not for or against but if this is approved it will set a president.

Ms. Terrie Crawley who is the next door neighbor came to oppose this request for the environmental impact it will have.

Mr. Greg Pickens stated he bought his place 2 years ago and when he purchased it he was told it was an unbuildable lot and he asks the Board to turn this down.

Mr. Moslow, also a neighbor, stated he bought a very expensive lot and he too thought this property was unbuildable.

Mr. Matt Roth stated that the flags have been set and the Corp of Engineers has seen what is on the plat and each is case by case with the Chesapeake Bay Act.

Supervisor Tomlin asked what is the Corps' jurisdiction in this case. Mr. Roth it is isolated wetlands if it connects and a DEQ wetland permit would be needed.

Mr. Chip Hudnall said he is a local builder and looking at the building permit report it needs to be approved. This land was passed down by her Father and he would hate for the land to be sold off.

Ms. Crawley noted that she didn't see where the utilities were depicted on the drawing. Mr. Pinnix said the septic is shown but they can't locate the water because of the plastic piping.

Supervisor Tomlin as he sees it, it can be built outside of the 100ft RPA. Supervisor Self questioned the size of the drain-field. Mr. Pinnix explained that there are many factors to get this drain-field where it is, it has to be 70 feet off shellfish waters, it can't be in the wetlands area etc.

Supervisor Self asked Mr. Pinnix in his opinion is this the only place for the drain-field to go? Mr. Pinnix said yes because of set-backs and encroachments. Supervisor Self then questioned if it could be placed off site.

With Chairman Jett removing his motion, Supervisor Richard F. Haynie motioned to table this request until May 12, 2016. Supervisor Long seconded the motion.
