The special called meeting was convened by Vice Chairman Jett due to Chairman Haynie seeking medical attention. This meeting was held at the Northumberland Courthouse located at 220 Judicial Place, Heathsville, VA 22473.

1. Opening of Meeting 4:30 P.M.

Information: A. EVB Roof Engineer Discussion

Mr. Dave Liebal with HDH Associates, architectural engineering firm, came to the meeting to answer any questions the Board may have related to the replacement of the roof on the old EVB building. Mr. Liebal gave a brief introduction on his findings during his site investigation. The existing "flat" roof system is a Spray Polyurethane Foam system that is past it's service life with active leaks, pondering water and a deteriorating surface. Observations made through openings in the ceiling showed a wood roof framing and a plywood deck. Based on measurements of the roof layout, an "A" frame sloped roof system would be limited to 2:12 to 3:12 slope new system. A Truss roof system bearing on exterior walls can provide an "A" frame slope and a C-channel light gauge framing system can provide an "A" frame slope roof system.

Mr. Liebal continued by providing several "A" frame roofing options to the Board such as slate, standing seam metal, asphalt shingles. Along with this, Mr. Liebal provided some information on a new low slope roofing option.

Supervisor Tomlin asked if this was Mr. Liebal's home what would he do that aesthetically blended and being most cost effective.

Mr. Liebal stated that he would choose a low sloped roof because he knows he can make it drain and watertight by keeping the same look the building has currently.

Supervisor Tomlin asked if the warmer temperatures would impact the low slope roof.

Mr. Liebal confirmed that the temperature would not impact the low slope roof.

Vice Chairman Jett questioned the 20–30-year finish warranty on the standing seam metal roof.

Mr. Liebal stated that the metal will last longer than that but that's a color warranty from the manufacturer based on several factors.

Supervisor Tomlin asked about what kind of time frame they would be looking at from the time of approval to completion. Specifically, he asked how long actual construction would take once the materials are on site.

Mr. Liebal estimated that actual construction of a low slope roof would take approximately three weeks. A light gauge framing or trusses would take a longer time.

Supervisor Tomlin asked which type of roof has the least potential to leak during construction.

Mr. Liebal confirmed that a low slope would have the least potential to leak.
